Avoiding a World War

Background:

The reasons of World War One were the assassination of the Archduke of Austria-Hungary by Serbia, causing Austria-Hungary and its allies to engage in a conflict with Serbia and its allies. Solution:

If another nation is conquering mass amounts of land, or starving/enslaving entire nations, the USA should send help, as in food and resources, to the victimized nations. The USA should not get involved with violence or alliances. Alliances turn a two person conflict into a fight of allies versus allies, and soon it is a global conflict. For example, in another world war two, when Hitler took over almost all of Europe, and was enslaving and massacring the Jewish citizens.
